The EU is vulnerable to supply chain disruption

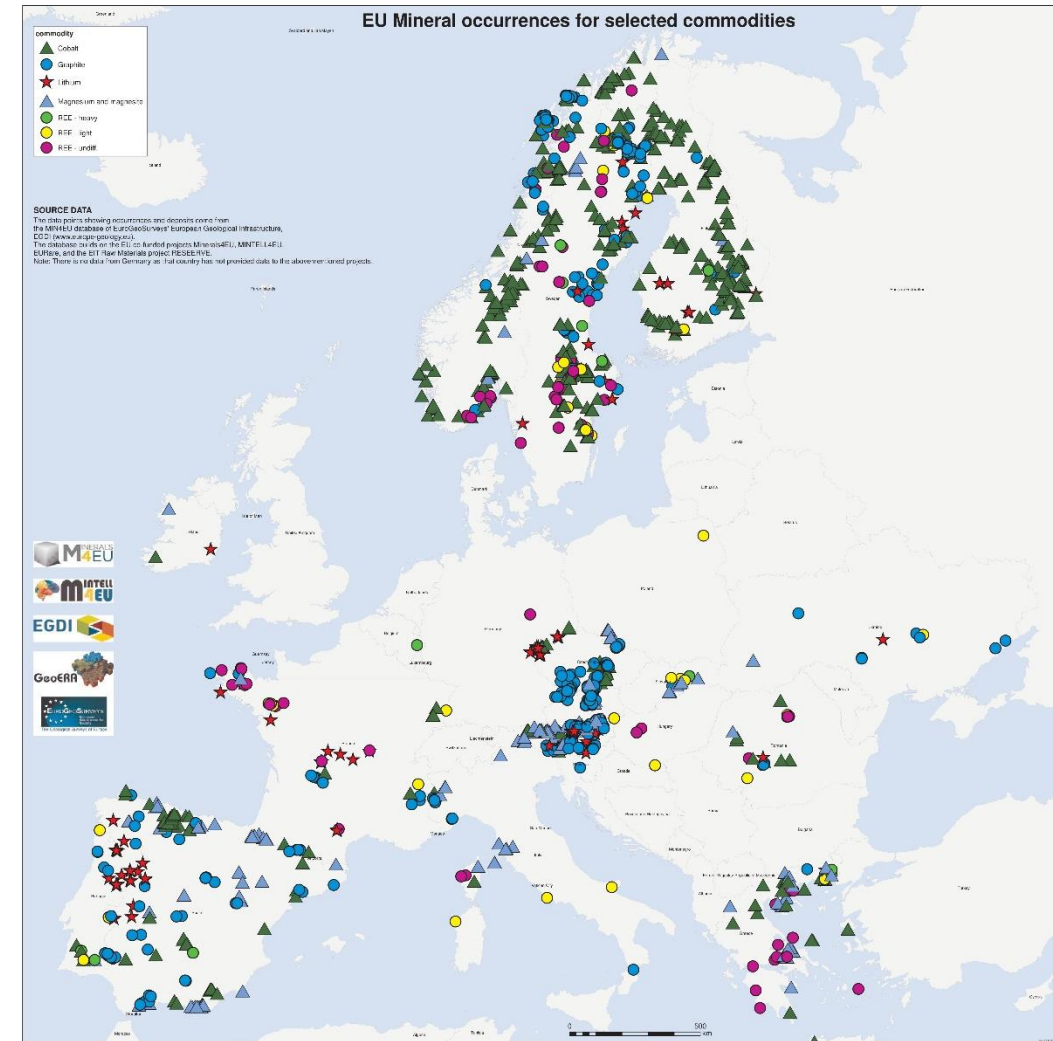

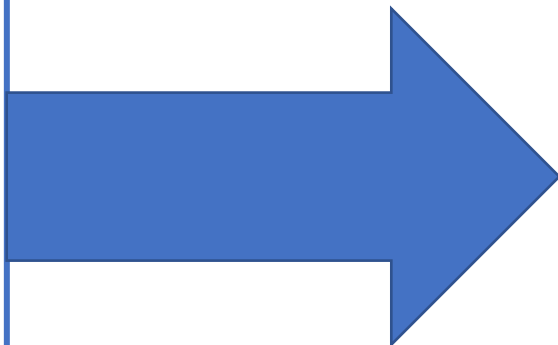

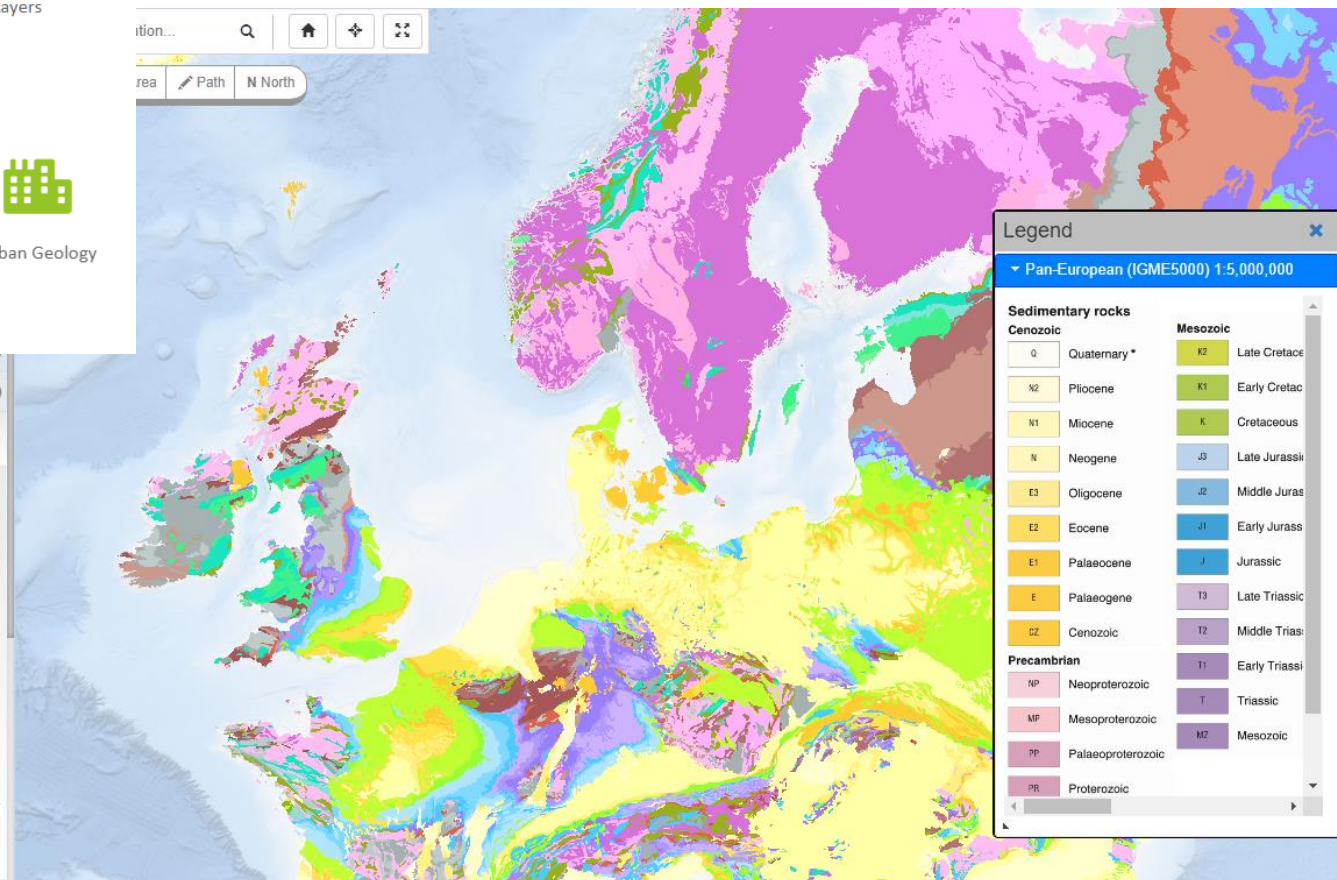
Pan-European (IGME5000) 1:5,000,000

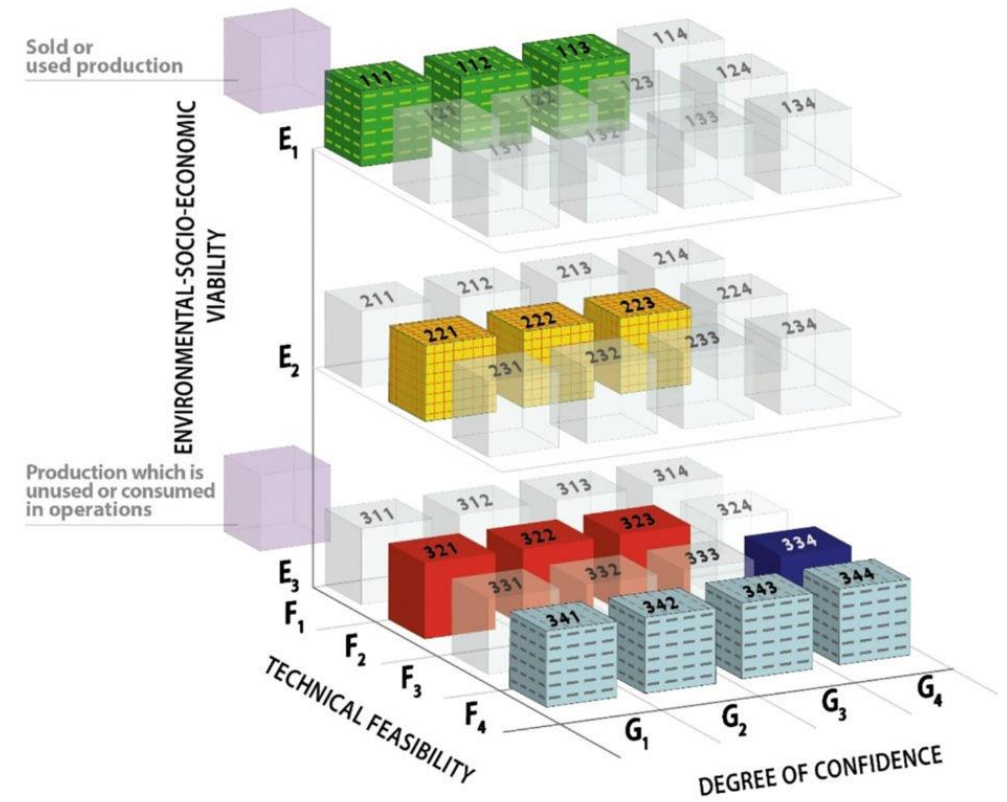
