# ROLE OF THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

- To formulate and administer Zambias foregn Policy;
- To establish and maintain Zambia's good International Relations;
- To coordinate the signing of treaties (Ageements and Conventions), pledges and contributions to the UN Agencies and other International Organisations;
- In short, to promote and protect Zambia s interst and maintain good international relations in order to contribute to sustainable development.

# ASSESSMENT OF OBLIGATIONS/BENEFITS OF ACCEDING TO A CONVENTION/TREATY

#### For Zambia to acced to any Convention or be Party to a Treaty or and Agreement, it must:

- > Assess the advantages and disadivantages of being a Member to such a Tready by engaging line Ministries and experts
- > We also know that by joining, we must adhere to a set of norms and rules governing the actions of member states and other actors at the international level;
- > Some of the benefits of joining, they provide a common platform to discuss and provide solutions to common challenges; provide technical, financial and material support to MS;
- > A good platform for sharing best practices, which may aid the collection of statistical information critical for comparative studies and policy formulation
- > Crucial in minimizing transaction costs Bargaining and settling of disputes, and strengthen the cooperation among member states.

## **Policy and Legal Obligations**

- Policy undertake the required process of accession;
- Stakeholder consultations, Cab Memos, Parliament
- Legal, assess any required changes to the existing domestic legislation and policies for implementation of the Convention;

# **Administrative Obligations**

#### Administrative obligations may include:

- Appointment of officials that will be charged with the responsibility of implementing the Water Convention agreed activities;
- Adequate briefing to all relevant stakeholders to ensure their buy-in; and

# **Financial Obligations**

#### Members to international Organisations are obliged to:

- Pay assessed contributions and also voluntary contributions;
- Financial resources will be required to:
  - Participate in the meetings of the Convention;
  - Implementation of the Water Convention; and
  - Expense on other administrative arrangements, such as staffing and information dissemination.
- Provision in the National budget for public spending is necessary.

# **Reporting Obligations**

#### REPORT MECHANISM

- Some organisations requires Member States to report progress or lack of it, on some of the agreed areas; and
- The reports have to be in line with established standards, which are specific in respect of a given standard.
- Normally require participation of all relevant stakeholders
