





# National workshop related to the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes: Nigor's accession process

Niger's accession process 2 – 3 March 2023 Niamey, Niger

## **Concept note**

# 1- Background and rationale

Niger shares 90% of its water resources with neighbouring countries. Rapidly increasing demand due to population growth, increased urbanisation, increase in irrigation farming and industrialization constitute the current challenges to these shared resources. Moreover, these challenges have been exacerbated by persistent drought and have led to greater dependence on groundwater resources. Effective cross-border cooperation can help address these challenges. In this regard, Niger has signed several agreements on its shared water resources. Niger is notably party to the Niger Basin Authority and the Lake Chad Basin Commission.

The secretariat of the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (Water Convention) has a long-standing cooperation with these two river basin commissions. Adopted on 17 March 1992 in Helsinki, Finland, the Water Convention aims to strengthen cooperation in the field of transboundary waters and to promote protection and sustainable use of transboundary surface waters and groundwaters. Initially limited to the Pan-European region, the 1992 Water Convention has been opened up for accession by all United Nations Member States, since 1 March 2016. Six African countries have already acceded to it and many others are in various stages of the process of accession.

In view of Niger's possible accession to the Water Convention, the Ministry of Hydraulics and Sanitation has been actively participating in the Convention's activities since 2018. In 2021 awareness raising activities at the regional level were organised to sensitise relevant stakeholders on the Water Convention. A national workshop is now being convened to raise awareness of the Convention and commit to a roadmap for accession and eventual implementation.

#### 2- Objectives

The general objective of the workshop is to inform relevant stakeholders about the Water Convention, to share about the processes initiated by Government of Niger to become party to the Water Convention and to discuss the next steps in the accession process.

Specifically, this will involve:

- ✓ Inform stakeholders about the Water Convention;
- ✓ To identify the challenges of cooperative management of transboundary rivers and international lakes at national, regional and international levels;
- ✓ Outline the content of the water convention in terms of benefits and obligations for Niger,
- ✓ Discuss the practical implementation of the Water Convention to address the challenges of water resources management in Niger, based on the experience of existing Parties;
- ✓ Examine the interaction and complementarity between the Water Convention and regional (ECOWAS and UEMOA) and sub-regional (NBA and LCBC) legal frameworks
- ✓ Discuss the next steps and road map in the accession process.

#### **3-** Expected results

- Stakeholders are informed about the Water Convention
- The challenges of concerted management of transboundary rivers and international lakes for Niger and at regional and sub-regional level are identified;
- The content of the water convention in terms of benefits and obligations for Niger is outlined and clarified;
- The interaction and complementarity between the Water Convention and regional (ECOWAS and UEMOA) and sub-regional (NBA and LTBC) legal frameworks is outlined
- The main lines of action for the practical implementation of the Convention have been identified:
- The next steps in the accession process are clearly defined.

## 4- Organisation of the national workshop

A national sharing workshop on the Convention will be held from <u>2-3 March 2023 in Niamey</u>. This national meeting will provide an opportunity to explain to all stakeholders the contours of the Convention and to agree on the next steps in the process of accession to the Water Convention.

The workshop will be co-facilitated by the Ministry of Hydraulics and Sanitation and the Secretariat of the Convention with the logistical support of UNDP. The workshop will be organised with the financial support of the European Union through the project "Promoting accession to the Water Convention" which aims to support the accession and implementation of the Water Convention and thus strengthen transboundary cooperation on water and the sustainable and peaceful management of shared water resources. The United Nations system will support the logistical organisation of the event as agreed with the host country.

## 5- Target audience

The participation of the basin organisations (NBA and LCBC) and the Niger riparian countries which are either parties to the Convention or also engaged in the accession process (Chad, Nigeria) is envisaged.

The targets for participation in this national meeting are as follows:

- Representatives from sectoral ministries (Ministry of Hydraulics and Sanitation, Agriculture, Livestock, Environment, Foreign Affairs, Finance, Land Use and Community Development, Interior, Health, Communication, Social Action, Justice)

- Local authorities and local populations;
- Basin organisations (NBA; LCBC);
- Countries sharing basins with Niger (Chad, Nigeria);
- ECOWAS, UEMOA, and other regional integration organisations
- Convention Secretariat and UN System in Niger
- European Union and other technical and financial partners
- Resource persons
