



Africa Mining Vision - AMV

- **Goal:** "Transparent, equitable and optimal exploitation of mineral resources to underpin "broad-based sustainable growth and socio-economic development
- A knowledge-driven African mining sector that catalyzes & contributes to the broadbased growth & development of, and is fully integrated into, a single African market.

Action Plan (2011): under review





Africa Mining Vision – AMV Linkages

- Down-stream linkages into mineral beneficiation and manufacturing;
- **Up-stream linkages** into mining capital goods, consumables & services industries;
- Side-stream linkages into infrastructure (power, logistics; communications, water) and skills & technology development (HRD and R&D);
- Mutually beneficial partnerships between the state, the private sector, civil society, local communities and other stakeholders; and
- A comprehensive knowledge of its mineral endowment.



Africa Mining Vision - AMV

- A sustainable and well-governed minerals sector that effectively garners and deploys resource rents and that is safe, healthy, gender & ethnically inclusive, environmentally friendly, socially responsible and appreciated by surrounding communities;
- A minerals sector that has become a key component of a diversified, vibrant and globally competitive industrializing African economy;
- A minerals sector that has helped establish a competitive African infrastructure platform, through the maximization of its propulsive local & regional economic linkages;



Africa Mining Vision - AMV

- A minerals sector that optimizes and husbands Africa's finite mineral resource endowments and that is diversified, incorporating both high value metals and lower value industrial minerals at both commercial and small-scale levels;
- A minerals sector that harness the potential of artisanal and small-scale mining to stimulate local/national entrepreneurship, improve livelihoods and advance integrated rural social and economic development; and
- A minerals sector that is a major player in vibrant and competitive national, continental and international capital and commodity markets.

- Established in 2013 by the Assembly of Heads of States in Africa
- To support member States in implementing policies and programs for the realization of the Africa Mining Vision (AMV).
- The Centre was first located within the ECA as a project for five years.
- In 2019, the AMDC was officially handed over to the AUC as a specialized agency of the African Union
- AMDC in transitioning journey to Conakry, Guinea
- Operationalization & institutionalization (Ratifications)


