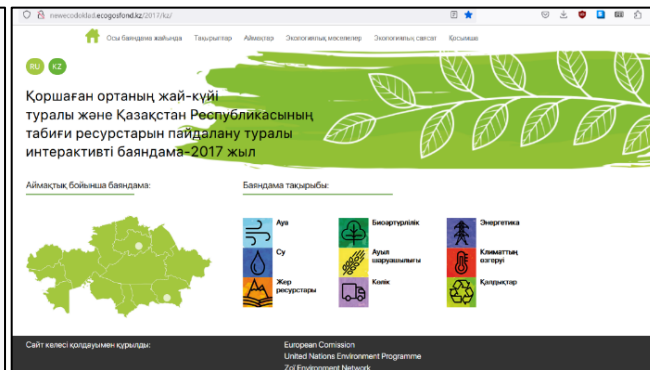
1. Capacity development and technical support on National State-of-the-Environment Reporting (NSoER)

National State-of-the-Environment Reports

- Information on quality of the environment and environmental pressures, in the context of economic development and policy responses
- Provides timely information for decision-makers and the public
- Continuous process: setting targets, monitoring, data analysis, reporting, setting targets...

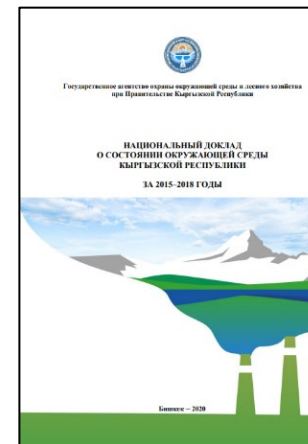


2021 NSoER of Kazakhstan

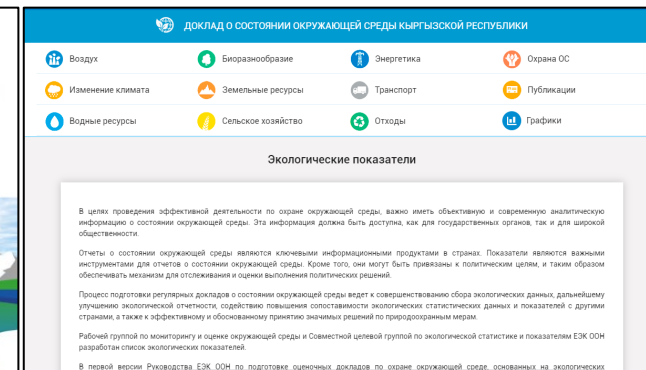

2015-2018 NSoER of the Kyrgyz Republic



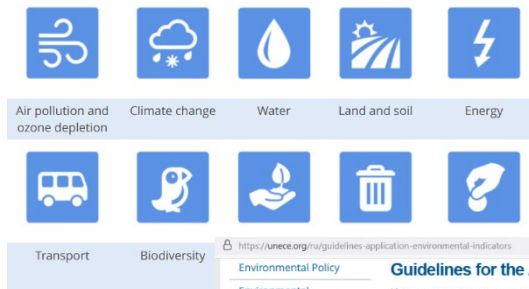

1. Capacity development and technical support on National State-of-the-Environment Reporting (NSoER)

Indicators and reporting:

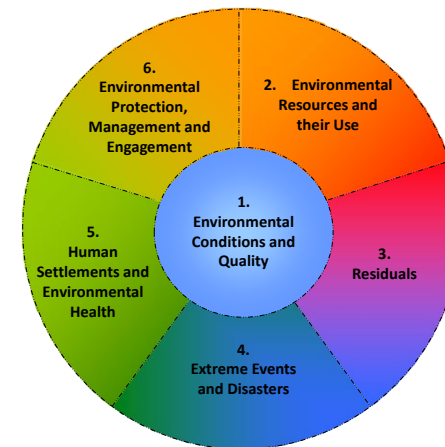
- Environmental indicators support collection of objective analytical information about the state of the environment
- Indicators track progress and support evaluation
- Indicators can be tied to policy goals
- Environmental indicators have been developed by UNECE
- UNECE Guidelines for the preparation of governmental reports on the state and protection of the environment

New structure according to FDES

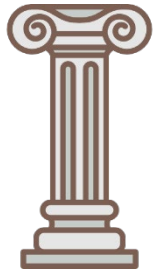

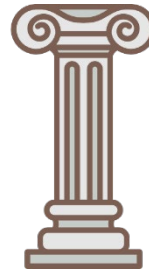
Aarhus Convention:

- Adopted in 1998, entered into force in 2001
- Protects every person's right to live in an environment adequate to their health and well-being
- Links environmental rights and human rights
- Links government accountability and environmental protection

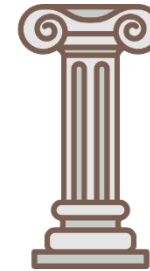


I. Access to information

National State-of-the-Environment Reports (Art. 5, para 4)



II. Public participation in decision-making



III. Access to justice

National State-of-the-Environment Reports

- Information on quality of the environment and environmental pressures
- Must be published regularly (minimum 3-4 years)
- Many ECE countries produce annual NSoERs
- Must be publicly disseminated and progressively become available in electronic databases

Joint UNEP-UNECE project on NSoER in Uzbekistan (2022-2023):

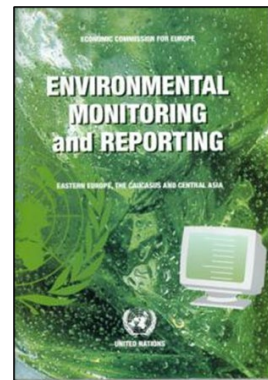
- Technical support and capacity building for development of new NSoER for the Republic of Uzbekistan
- Timeframe for implementation: mid-2022- October 2023

Joint UNEP-UNECE project on NSoER in 2 Central Asian countries (2024-2025):

- Technical support and capacity building for development of new NSoERs in two Central Asian countries (TBC based on demand/expression of interest)
- Timeframe for implementation: 2024-2025

Planned updating of the UNECE guidance and publication on “Environmental Monitoring and Reporting: Eastern Europe, the Caucasus and Central Asia” and UNECE-UNEP joint regional training on NSOER development using the new updated guidelines:

- Planned updating of 2003 UNECE guidance and publication on planned regional capacity development workshop for countries in EECCA region
- Timeframe for implementation: 2024



EU4Environment – Water and Data (2021-2024)

UBA, ADA, OiEau, OECD, UNECE

Two pillars:

- Water resources: support a more sustainable use of freshwater resources
- **Environmental data: extend and improve the use of sound environmental statistics**

Environmental data: extend and improve the use of sound environmental statistics

Upcoming UNECE supported activities (together with EAA and UNEP)

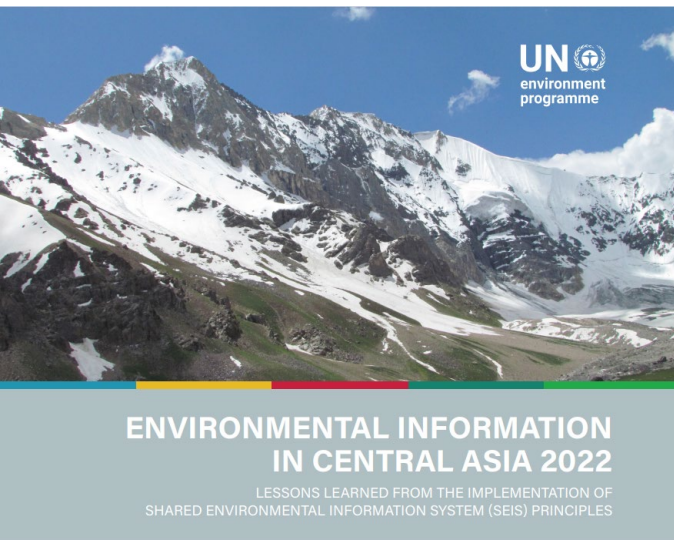
- Planned regional training workshop on air quality and emissions to air statistics and indicators on 4-5 May 2023 to support reporting on SEIS
- Review of the environmental theme air in 2023, by using the SEIS assessment framework while employing the revised UNECE environmental Indicators.
- 20th session of the Joint Task Force on Environmental Statistics And Indicators on 16-18 October 2023
- Addressing of gaps in international reporting through capacity development (e.g. during 25th session of WGEMA and regional training on air quality and emissions to air statistics and indicators
- Training on waste statistics and indicators in 2024

Projects comes to an end in 2024: Countries are invited to think already now about further needs that could be covered under a new project

- Lessons learned from the implementation of Shared environmental information system (SEIS) principles in Central Asia during 2016-2022
- Stock-taking of relevant UNEP and UNECE capacity-development initiatives on environmental data sharing and on National-State of Environment reporting in support of SEIS implementation in Central Asia
- Outlines a way forward to make SEIS an everyday reality and essential tool for environmental information management in Central Asia

Project rationale:

- Internationally comparable e-waste statistics and information on e-waste management in the Western Balkans is limited 
- Provide technical assistance to 5 Western Balkan countries to assess e-waste statistics 
- Implementation by ITU Europe Office, UNEP Europe Office & Vienna Office and UNITAR-SCYCLE, as well as respective administrations and statistical offices of the beneficiary countries.

Update on progress of joint UNEP-ITU-UNITAR capacity development data project for the generation of an “E-Waste Monitor for the Western Balkans”

- **Aims and Objectives:**

Project **aims** to collect statistics, map the situation of e-waste management and legislation in the beneficiary countries as well as build subregional capacities in the field of e-waste monitoring and reporting.

The project has the following **objectives**:

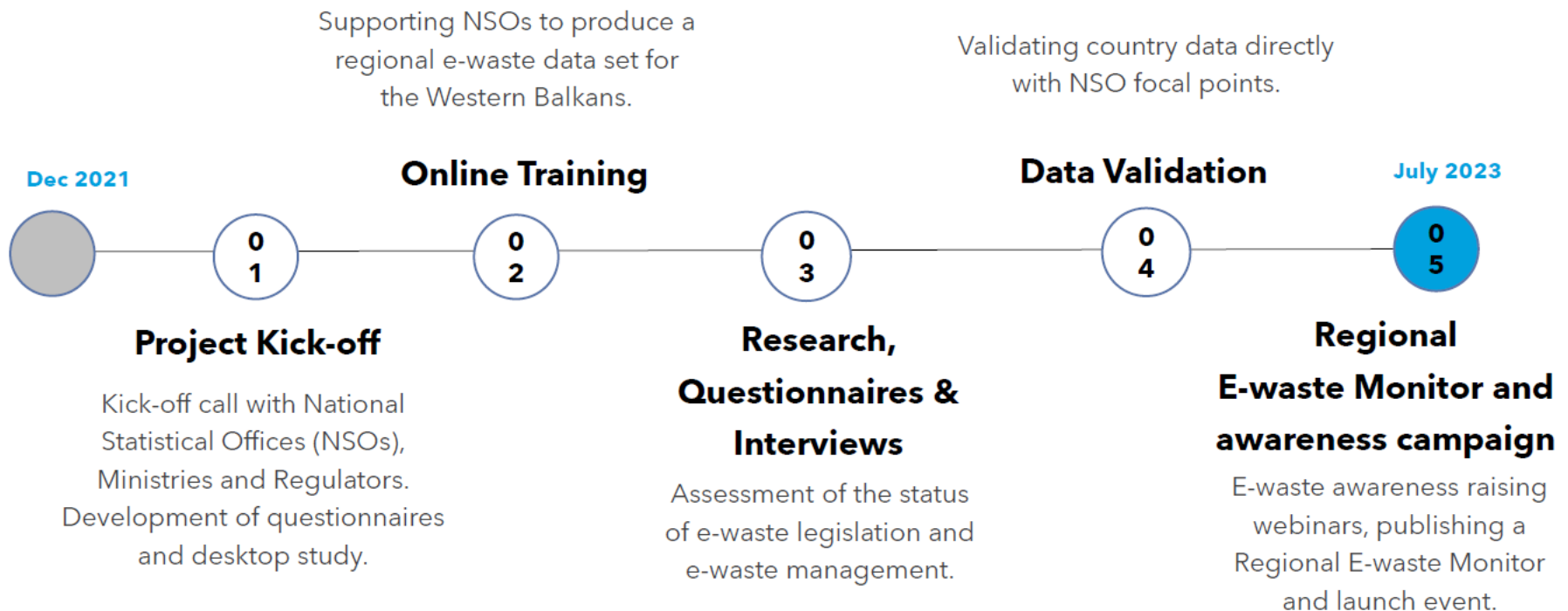
- **Train NSOs** to produce e-waste data for **monitoring of SDG 12.5.1**.
- Contribute to the development of **internationally comparable e-waste statistics**.
- **Inform** policy makers, industries, and business about regional e-waste data.
- Support the development of national and regional counter-measures through policies, regulations, awareness raising and industrial response.

RESULT 1: FIVE COUNTRY PROFILES ELABORATED, WHICH INCLUDES AN ASSESSMENT OF THE STATUS OF E-WASTE LEGISLATION AND E-WASTE MANAGEMENT USING DESKTOP RESEARCH, QUESTIONNAIRES AND FOLLOW-UP INTERVIEWS



RESULT 2: FIVE NATIONAL STATISTICAL OFFICES (NSO) TRAINED TO PRODUCE A REGIONAL E-WASTE DATA SET FOR THE WESTERN BALKANS, INCLUDING ESTIMATES WHERE DATA MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE.



RESULT 3: VALIDATED PROFILES FOR THE FIVE COUNTRIES BY NSO THROUGH ONLINE ONE-TO-ONE FOLLOW-UP WITH EACH OF THE FIVE COUNTRIES.

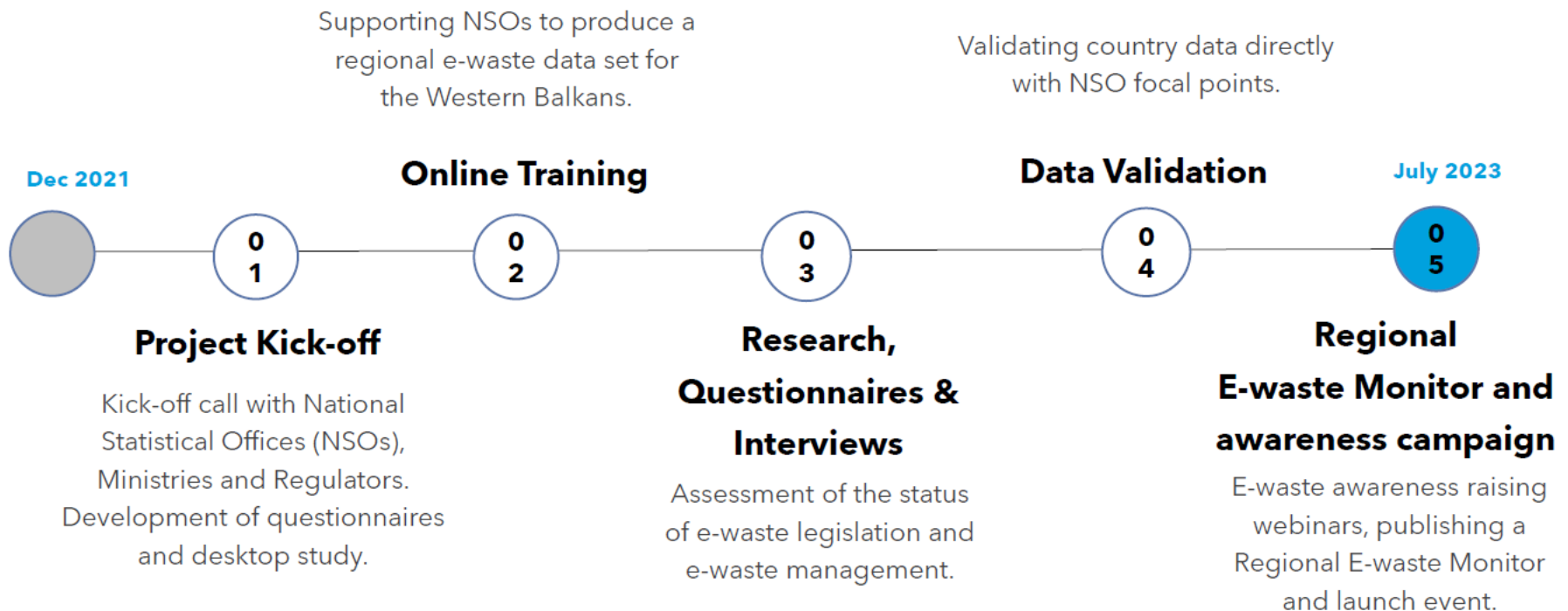

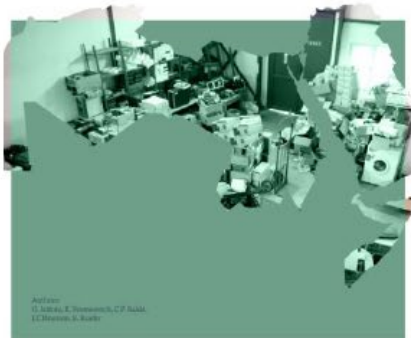
