Proposal to develop a new standard for dried rosehip

Submitted by the Central Asian Working Group to Promote Exports of Agricultural Produce (CAWG)

Background

Central Asian Working Group to promote the export of agricultural products from the region agreed to propose the development of a new standard for rosehip within UNECE. (May 2023)



Definition of produce



Rosehip in dried form is sold in markets and used to make tea and infusions. Dried rosehip can be sold as whole fruit or in pieces.

The composition and content of the produce

Nutritional value per 100 g: Calorie 284 kcal Proteins 3.4 g *Fats* 1.4 *q* Carbohydrates 48.3 g Dietary fiber 23.2 g Water 14 g Vitamin A, beta carotene Vitamin B1, Vitamin B2, Vitamin C,

Vitamin E, Iron, Fe Others







There are not any international standards for rosehip: quality control and marketing in Central Asia are based on national standards (Interstate standard in the CIS and Technical Regulations of Eurasian Economic Union)



Goals and expectations of producers

- Uniform requirements for product quality will facilitate the trading procedure of hip roses for producers and exporters;
- Facilitation of entry to alternative, more profitable markets will in turn increase production and export volumes.
