How SDG 6.5.2 can promote cooperation

- SDG 6.5.2 process is a useful means by which to review status of transboundary water cooperation at both national and transboundary levels
- Co-ordination between neighbouring countries can help:
 - Promote dialogue
 - Develop common understanding on
 - basic data
 - data gaps
 - key challenges and opportunities
 - Agree to set common targets and action plans



How SDG 6.5.2 can promote cooperation

- SMAB example

- Senegal-Mauritanian Aquifer Basin (SMAB) between Gambia, Guinea Bissau, Mauritania and Senegal
 - Call for greater cooperation on SMAB in part following data gaps identified during 2017 reporting exercise for 6.5.2
 - 2021 Ministerial Declaration on SMAB signed








How SDG 6.5.2 can promote cooperation

- Argentina and Chile example

- 1991 bilateral agreement that includes transboundary waters protocol between Argentina and Chile
- 6.5.2 reports offers opportunity to reach common understanding of progress under the protocol
 - 2nd 6.5.2 report include river and lake basins between Chile and Argentina
 - 3rd 6.5.2 report will include shared aquifers
