DETA: The secure internet database for exchanging approval documentation between the Contracting Parties of the 1958 Agreement, as required to be established by the UNECE, according to Revision 3 of this Agreement.

DETA - State of play

Facts and figures:

- 36 Contracting Parties (+1) have notified their DETA Focal Point
- App. 46.000 approvals uploaded (+4.000) by 19 TAA
- App. 5810 manufacturers (+40) are uploaded / could be selected by TAA
- 15 manufacturers (+1) have access to DETA (only to their own approvals) (manufacturer's access is to be requested via their approval authority and to be forwarded to the DETA Administrator)

Mass Upload Functionality

 \rightarrow implemented in DETA

(10 TAAs currently working on implementation within their organisations)

Two-factor authentication

→ The IWG on DETA agreed on improving the system security by introducing a 'two-factor authentication with e-mail' solution.

DETA - State of play – Developments

• Unique Identifier marking

Considerations at GR's ongoing (questionnaire WP.29-188-20 circulated to GR's)

First observations:

→ benefits for most UN Regulations under purview by GRs not obvious (e.g. due to absence of additional marking requirements).

 \rightarrow Several GRs agreed to / are considering a general ban of the UI marking.

The IWG DETA is considering the consequences and will advise WP.29 in due time.

DETA - State of play – Extension of scope

Extension of scope DETA following WP.29/AC.2 assignment

• Access in the course of PTI (1997 Agreement)

→ IWG on PTI informed the IWG on DETA that access to DETA is currently not required.

• Access of Technical Services:

The IWG on DETA agreed for **notified Technical Services**:

- → general read access only to all Approval Certificates
- \rightarrow no access to Information Documents and Test Reports

(The IWG on DETA is considering the procedure for notifying a Focal Point of the TS).

WP.29 is invited to consider:

endorsement of the 'two-factor authentication by e-mail'

Allowing read access to DETA for notified Technical Services to all Approval Certificates
