Summary

The present document reports on the contributions and provisional expenditures related to the implementation of the programme of work for 2022–2024 for the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (Water Convention) (ECE/MP.WAT/63/Add.1), adopted at the ninth session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention (Geneva, 29 September–1 October 2021). The document contains detailed contributions and expenditures from 1 January to 31 December 2022 for all Water Convention-related trust funds, including for the Convention's global opening, the reporting on indicator 6.5.2 of the Sustainable Development Goals, European Union National Policy Dialogues in Central Asia and the European Union "Water Resources and Environmental Data" programme in Eastern Partner Countries. This document is complementary to the Report on the implementation of activities under the Water Convention in 2022 (ECE/MP.WAT/WG.1/2023/3).

I. Approximate balance as at 31 December 2021

1. The approximate provisional balance of the Water Convention's trust funds as at 31 December 2021 was \$4,291,296.1

III. Provisional expenditures in 2022

3. Total provisional expenditures from 1 January to 31 December 2022 were \$4,137,135. At the time of preparing this report, the 2022 United Nations accounts had not been closed. Amounts listed below are therefore provisional and might be subject to changes at the time of closure of the United Nations accounts. A breakdown of costs by programme area is set out in table 2 below.

IV. Approximate provisional balance as at 31 December 2022

4. The approximate provisional balance of the various Water Convention trust funds as at 31 December 2022 was \$5,166,842.³

^a Categories of expenditures in the present report follow the categories in the Umoja administrative and financial system. The footnotes below explain the different categories.

^b This includes staff costs, consultancies costs and consultants' travel costs.

^c This includes costs for individual contractors, for example, for: outsourced translations; procurement, for example for catering services for conferences and events, etc.

d This includes all logistics costs, for example, for events organized outside Geneva, and costs for translation, layout and printing of publications by the United Nations Office at Geneva, as well as extrabudgetary interpretation costs.

^e This includes staff travel costs, as well as travel support to eligible participants.

f Expenses reported under programme area 1 include some expenses for projects on the ground implemented under subprogramme area 1.3. Such costs were not incorporated into the budget of the programme of work adopted by the Meeting of the Parties at its ninth session, as these are project-driven activities dependent on the availability of funds.

g Expenses reported under programme area 3 reflect all expenditures related to the contributions from the European Union for Eastern Partner Countries (in the framework of the EU4Environment Water and Data project) and for Central Asia. However, it should be noted that the two projects funded activities beyond the Convention's programme of work. In particular, at least 15 per cent of the expenditures are related to the implementation of the Protocol on Water and Health to the Water Convention and its programme of work.

^h This includes costs for grants for not-for-profit organizations to carry out activities under specific projects.

ⁱ This corresponds to refunds of costs related to contractual services that had been cancelled.

³ This figure shows the approximate provisional balance of the various Water Convention trust funds as at 31 December 2022. However, out of that amount, approximately \$500,000 will have to be refunded to the European Union, since that sum remained unspent from European Union-funded projects that ended in mid-2021 and mid-2022.
