Global Land Tool Network (GLTN): Phase 4 (2024 – 2027) priorities



Objectives

- 1. Accelerate reforms of the land sector by fostering global, regional and national discourse on responsible land governance and transformative land policies and frameworks.
- 2. Institutionalize inclusive, gender-responsive and fit-for-purpose land tools to scale up tenure security interventions.
- 3. Monitor land-related commitments and obligations by mobilizing international, regional and national partners to track progress and build evidence.
- 4. Share and develop capacities, knowledge, research and resources on land tenure security.

Principles

- i. Recognition of a continuum of land rights: diverse forms of tenure should be recognised and afforded adequate protection according to local systems and needs.
- ii. Pro-poor outcomes: GLTN activities should produce increasing equality of outcomes for those most in need.
- iii. Gender-responsive outcomes: GLTN activities should produce increasing equality of outcome for women and girls and should consistently aspire to being gender transformative.
- iv. Youth-responsive outcomes: GLTN activities should produce increasing equality of outcome for young people, both in terms of immediate need and in terms of intergenerational equity.
- v. Fit for purpose: land management and administration should have the demonstrated potential to be functional and effective in the specific context where it operates and work within a land governance framework that provides clearly defined objectives.

Thematic priorities

- 1. Promoting consistency in the treatment of tenure security and land governance across multilateral environment agreements and natural resources forums, with an emphasis on climate adaptation.
- 2. The effective implementation of tenure security initiatives and good land governance to support the achievement of human rights for all.
- 3. Addressing inequitable access to the use of land in urban development and the inappropriate treatment of land and property in local financial and national economic systems
- 4. The protection of housing, land and property rights in the humanitariandevelopment-peace building nexus
