Monitoring and Assessment under the Water Convention

Most relevant articles on monitoring and data sharing:

Article 4: Parties shall establish programmes for monitoring the conditions of transboundary water

Article 6: Parties shall provide the widest exchange of information as early as possible, on issues covered by the provisions of the Convention

Article 11: Riparians shall establish and implement joint programmes for monitoring the conditions of transboundary waters, agree upon pollution parameters, carry out joint assessments and harmonize rules for setting up and operation of monitoring programmes










Regional assessments of transboundary rivers, lakes and groundwaters: 2007, 2011








Information collected for the Second Assessment:

- Surface and groundwater resources
- Pressures and their importance
- Quality and quantity status of waters
- Transboundary impacts (descriptive)
- Cooperation: joint bodies, agreements, joint monitoring etc (descriptive)
- Trends
- Management response measures taken (descriptive)

Served to exchange views & experience, harmonize approaches, keep the status of transboundary waters under scrutiny



From monitoring and assessment to...



Nexus assessments under the Water Convention (from 2013)

Task Force on Water-Food-Energy-Ecosystems Nexus

Monitoring and assessment has been integrated into thematic activities (e.g. adaptation to climate change, water-food-energy-ecosystems nexus), or has been a component in projects on the ground (Afghan-Tajik cooperation, Drin GEF project, SMAB)

Water allocation work



Global workshop on exchange of data and information in transboundary basins and WGMA Dec 2019:

7 regional groups:

- When updating existing guidance documents on monitoring and assessment, it would be useful to integrate experiences from the different regions
- Regional or subregional workshops were widely considered to be useful, not only for review of and learning about the Convention's guidelines, but also for exchange of experiences.
- Some regions indicated a need for training sessions on specific topics.
- Financing of monitoring and assessment was perceived to be an important issue, including possibilities of optimizing monitoring and assessment programmes, taking into account the costs and potential of modern technology.

Programme of work 2022-2024

- Develop a publication on good practices and lessons learnt in transboundary data exchange
- Update Strategies for Monitoring and Assessment of Transboundary Rivers, Lakes and Groundwaters
- Up to 3 training or regional workshops/sessions on monitoring, information and data
- Tailored assistance for developing joint or coordinated monitoring or information and data exchange upon country request, pending availability of resources



Programme of Work (PoW) 2025-2027



A new programme of work under the Water Convention is adopted every 3 years by the Meeting of the Parties.



Future programme of works will need to reflect the Convention's global nature and respond to new challenges and priorities.



The process will start with the collection of recommendations by various subsidiary bodies under the Water Convention about future activities to be included in the next PoW

Drafting process

The Bureau, with the support of secretariat, will develop a **first draft** of the new PoW 2025-2027 on the basis of the **survey's outcome** and of the **recommendations by various subsidiary bodies**.



The draft PoW will be presented and discussed during the joint session of the Working Group on Monitoring and Assessment and the Working Group on IWRM taking place on 6-8 May 2024 in Geneva.

Comments and additional recommendations will be integrated in a revised draft that will be submitted for approval to the Meeting of the Parties in October 2024.
