#### **Mandate**



9th Meeting of the Parties (29.9.-1.10.2021, Geneva) entrusted the Working Group on Monitoring and Assessment to collect good practices and lessons learned in transboundary data sharing and synthesize them into a publication.

The 4<sup>th</sup> joint meeting of the Working Groups on Integrated Water Resources Management (IWRM) and on Monitoring and Assessment (Tallinn, 28–30 June 2022) **approved the outline** of the publication and the **case study template**.

The purpose of the publication is to collect good practices and lessons learned, including **real global examples of challenges and solutions** for transboundary data sharing through:

- Collection of case studies
- Workshops and meetings
- Reporting under the Water Convention and on SDG indicator 6.5.2
- Projects and work under the Water Convention

#### **Process**



9th Meeting of the Parties (Geneva, 29 September – 1 October 21)

Draft Outline prepared for the Expert Meeting on Monitoring, Assessment and Data Exchange (13 and 14 April 22)

Draft Outline approved at the **Joint Working Group on IWRM and M&A** (28-30 June 22).

Collection of **over 60 case studies** from around the world through **open call** and **two regional workshops** (July 22 - June 23)

First draft for the Expert Meeting on Good Practices and Lessons Learned in Transboundary Data Exchange (Geneva /hybrid, 18–19 April 23): Review by 38 experts, validation of the structure, commitments for additional case studies and lessons learned.

Second draft under review by the WGMA + group work on key messages (17-18 October 23)

Approval of the key messages of publication from the joint meeting of WGIWRM and WGMA (6-8 May 24)

Launch at the 10th Meeting of the Parties (23-25 October 24)


#### **Case Studies and Lessons Learned**

A lesson learned is described as a **recommendation** about a certain concept or approach that has proven to be **beneficial or effective** as derived **from practical experience** in a specific situation.

A good practice (see case studies throughout the publication) is a case situation in which *certain concepts or approaches* proved to be *beneficial or effective* in a *particular context*.

Each case study refers to several lessons learned. Similarly, each draft key message is drawn from several lessons learned.




Case study 1. Sharing of information between Chile and Argentina
