
The Protocol on Water and Health



- Adopted in 1999, entered into force in 2005
- 28 Parties as of November 2023, 36 Signatories, over 40 UNECE-WHO/Europe Member states working in its framework
- Objective: to protect human health and well-being through sustainable water management and by preventing, controlling and reducing water-related diseases

• Scope:

- Surface water and groundwater
- Estuaries and coastal waters
- Enclosed waters available for bathing
- Water in the course of abstraction, transport, treatment or supply
- Wastewater from collection, transport, treatment to discharge or reuse
- Legally binding treaty, brings together environment & health sectors
- UNECE and WHO/Europe provide joint secretariat functions









Key obligations




- Set national and/or local targets on water, sanitation, hygiene and health
- Every three years, submit national summary reports on progress
- Maintain and improve systems for surveillance and early warning of water-related diseases and ensure response capacity
- Strengthen public awareness, education and training and ensure accessibility of public information
- Promote international cooperation, including exchange between countries and peer-to-peer support





Previous activities on climate change under the Protocol





- Guidance on Water Supply and Sanitation in Extreme Weather Events developed by the previous Task Force on extreme weather events in 2008-2010
- Global workshop on building climate resilience through improving water management and sanitation at national and transboundary levels (March 2021, joint workshop with the Water Convention)
- Background note on increasing resilience to climate change through the Protocol prepared in 2022

 – conceptual framing
- Policy impact: some Parties set climate-sensitive targets
- Country support: capacity building on climate-resilient water and sanitation planning





Climate change activities under the Protocol



- Every three years, Parties to the Protocol adopt a programme of work, reflecting priorities on water, sanitation, hygiene and health in the pan-European region
- Programme of work for 2023-2025 includes a dedicated **area on increasing resilience to climate change**, while climate change is a key consideration across all programme areas
- Programme area aimed at strengthening resilience and preparedness to climate-related effects at policy, strategic and practitioner level
- Activities are targeted to:
 - Building awareness and collecting evidence on increasing resilience to climate change
 - Developing policy/technical guidance
 - **Strengthening capacities**, including for water and wastewater operators, to address climate impacts on water resources and water supply and sanitation services
 - Promoting linkages with global climate processes and related national planning documents





Strategic Roundtable under the Protocol

(13-14 November)



- First "strategic conversation" under the Protocol on climate change
- Strategic paper developed by the University of Bristol to support the preparation of and discussions at the meeting
- Roundtable will inform future activities under the 2023-2025 programme of work and beyond
- Main objective of the workshop: scoping



- Identify key needs and strategic priorities for states working within the framework of the Protocol
- Discuss which can be addressed under the Protocol and how
- Avoid duplication: identify synergies between the Protocol's framework and actors/activities such as global climate processes and regional commitments

 1 December 2023 (will become available in Russian)
- Secretariat to collect input from the meeting and produce an outcome document for the Roundtable, with support from the University of Bristol
- Strategic Roundtable to inform future activities such as:
 - Preparation of guidance and tools
 - Support to national activities on the setting of climate-sensitive targets
 - Uptake of climate considerations in other thematic programme areas, incl. capacity building
 - Recommendations on streamlining Protocol-related processes with global and regional processes (e.g. development of National Adaptation Plans)
- Task Force on Target Setting and Reporting to discuss future steps with regards to target setting
- Lead Parties and Bureau will discuss follow-up
