National structure – Focal and Coordinating point between national competent authorities/organisations and the Permanent Secretariat
































Projects and Initiatives towards Digitalization

Permanent Secretariat is currently working on initiatives aiming to introduce digital solutions on transport



Digitalization of e-CMR

- 2020 / 2021 Analysis of eCMR pilot projects, existing prototypes and tools
- 2021 / 2022 External consultations with eCMR solutions providers, participation at UN ECE expert meetings on operationalization of eCMR
- 2022 / 2023 WG meetings on eCMR pilot project between Tajikistan and Uzbekistan and drafting the next steps on digitalization of e-CMR

Main conclusions

- Existing prototypes can not be implemented in TRACECA countries without required adjustments related to customs operations (mostly introduced in EU countries information systems do not have functionality for customs).
- Some prototypes rely on Cloud services for data storage, which will not be accepted by some countries due to the security issues.
- Preliminary information/declaration consists of mostly identical data sets, which requires additional time spent on filling in the data.
- Ways of authentication and electronic signature requirements differ (mutual recognition of esignature has to be regulated)





Approaches in Digitalization of TRACECA Corridor

Bottom - Up

- Activities based on specific needs / interest of TRACECA countries
- Pilot implementation of specific digitalization projects, e.g.:
 - o e-CMR
 - o e-CIM/SMGS
 - Systematic Customs to Customs data exchange

O ...

Common Core

Harmonization based on globally recognized standards, recommendations and best practices, e.g.,:

- UN CEFACT Standards
- UN CITRAL Model Laws
 - WCO Standards and Recommendations
 - EU e-FTI Regulation

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Top-Down

- Support of existing regional / sub-regional initiatives
- New initiatives for regional / TRACECA arrangements, e.g.:
 - Framework Agreement on
 Digitalization (with focus on data composition, methods of data transmission / storage, data protection, recognition of electronic digital signatures and authentication methods)

Synergies with partnering organizations: UN (ECE, ESCAP), International Transport Organizations (OSJD, CIT, UIC, IRU), Development Banks (WB, ADB), WCO, EU, OECD, OSCE, USAID, TITR, ...
