SDG 6 reporting (GLAAS 2021/2022)

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are global aspirational targets for 2030. SDG 6 aims to ensure the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all. Governments are expected to set their own national targets guided by the global level of ambition while taking into account national circumstances. This section highlights data for the two SDG 6 means of implementation indicators that WHO, in collaboration with partners, monitors through the GLAAS initiative.

Target 6.a aims to expand international cooperation and capacity-building support to developing countries in water- and sanitation-related activities and programmes. Indicator 6.a.1 tracks the amount of water- and sanitation-related official development assistance (ODA) that is included in a government-coordinated spending plan.

Target 6.b aims to support and strengthen the participation of local communities in improving woter and sanitation management. Indicator 6.b.1 tracks the participation of local communities in water and sanitation management within a country, by looking at the existence of procedures in law or policy for participation, as well as the actual level of participation.










GLAAS data portal










GLAAS 2024/2025 cycle timeline

- Additional questions/focus on climate resilience and gender
- Revised section on human resources/workforce for WASH

eGLAAS:

 Based on positive responses last cycle, countries will be able to choose between using eGLAAS (online data collection tool) or the fillable pdf version of the survey.

GLAAS products:

- Country highlights available on the data portal as soon as the quality assurance process for the country survey is completed (prior to the release of the report)
- GLAAS 2025 report
- Regional highlights







Next steps for countries to know and plan

- Country survey launch April 2024
- Participate in GLAAS trainings March to June
- Decide on eGLAAS or PDF version of survey
- Exchange with stakeholders in your country and the WHO regional focal point
- Establish the process to complete the survey
- Submit the completed GLAAS country survey to the WHO regional focal point with deadline 15 October 2024
