- Brain drain to other parts of the world offering better economic opportunities, more shock resilience and a cleaner environment
- Responsible transition to the 'green' nexus sustainable and affordable energy and water supply and sustainable waste management
- Reversing soil degradation for domestic food production, to promote sustainable agriculture, fit for consumption and export
