United Nations Economic Cooperation for Europe for the period 2018-2021.<sup>3</sup> The evaluation was part of the United Nations Secretariat's regular program, which periodically evaluates selected aspects of its operations. For nearly forty years, UN/CEFACT has been a key forum for standards setting in the field of trade facilitation and electronic business. The goal of this session is to discuss the future of the UN/CEFACT, building on progress in key projects and to determine priority areas for the future.

In response to the outcomes of the seventieth Commission session, the country representatives together with partner agencies, will build on existing UN/CEFACT expertise, and on prior work, with the goal of exchanging experiences, sharing success stories and reviewing progress towards the digital and green transformations. They will further discuss how digital and green transformations can be integrated into policy guidance and capacity building, and how to promote implementation of UN/CEFACT standards and supporting tools. Furthermore, country representatives will make suggestions on policy and governance directions to adapt to global and organizational challenges.
