#### Note from the secretariat

Summary

The present note outlines information received by the secretariat thus far regarding Parties nomination of officers (chairs and members) to be elected to the treaty bodies under the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (Espoo Convention) and the Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment for the intersessional period 2024-2026.

Delegations, that wish to nominate officers, but have not yet informed the secretariat, will be invited to do so ahead of the present sessions, by 16 October 2023.

The Meetings of the Parties to the Convention and the Meeting of the Parties to the Protocol are invited to consider, and, as needed supplement the nominations of officers to the Bureau, the Working Group on Environmental Assessment and Strategic Environmental Assessment, and the Implementation Committee, set out in the present document, with a view to electing officers for the next intersessional period 2024–2026. In accordance with the rules of procedure (rule 19.1), in electing officers due account should be taken of the need to ensure that officers adequately represent different interests of the UNECE region.

For the Implementation Committee, the Meetings of the Parties should elect Parties for serving two terms. Each elected Party should appoint a permanent and an alternate Committee member.

A record of officers nominated by Parties from 2001 until to date is provided for information to the Meetings of the Parties, highlighting Parties that have never or not recently been represented in the treaty bodies.

<sup>(</sup>c) To better ensure a rotation/turnover among the Bureau members, the length of the mandate/terms of service should be limited to a maximum of two consecutive terms (or intersessional periods) for each Party to the Convention and the Protocol (with the exception of the European Commission, which represents a regional economic integration organization). Parties that have never or not recently nominated officers to the Bureau or other treaty bodies should be encouraged to do so.
