

- Create green jobs



The draft regional urban forestry opportunity plan is meant to guide action across the ECE region.

It is not specific to any country, institution or other stakeholder.

The 80th session of the Committee on Forests and the Forest Industry recommended the Plan be submitted to the 2023 session for possible adoption.

The 44th session of the ECE/FAO Joint Working Party on Forest Statistics, Economics and Management reviewed, commented on and supported the Draft Urban Forestry Opportunities Plan.





#### **Vision**

- Urban and peri-urban forests are developed to deliver multiple essential ecosystem services that benefit local urban and peri-urban communities and contribute to national policy objectives, the SDGs, and global goals for climate action, disaster risk reduction, biodiversity conservation, landscape restoration, and sustainable cities.
- b) Urban and peri-urban forests are managed sustainably, guided by national, subnational, and city authority policies, regulations, strategies, and plans that are implemented with adequate resources over time.



#### Goals

- Raise awareness of the benefits of SUPF and the need for sustainable resource management
- Strengthen governance, policies, regulatory frameworks, and financing for SUPF at the national, sub-national, and local levels.
- Provide guidance for, and enhance the development and implementation of, masterplans, management plans and good practices in SUPF.
- Strengthen technical and human capacities for the implementation of SUPF programs.
- Build inclusive partnerships and participatory approaches for developing and delivering SUPF programs and initiatives.



#### **Structure: Five Thematic Areas**

#### A. Awareness of benefits and sustainable management

• Awareness raising; benefit assessment; recognition of need for sustainable management

#### B. Governance, policy, and regulatory frameworks

 Dedicated policies and programs; regulatory frameworks; clear governance structures; sustainable funding programs

#### C. Planning and management

 Sound understanding of SUPF resource; strategic management approaches; widespread use of good practice and suitable technologies

#### D. Technical and human capacities

Dedicated urban forestry training and education; collaborative networks and communities of practice

#### E. Inclusive partnerships and participatory approaches

Cross-sectoral and multistakeholder networks; inclusive and participatory approaches to SUPF
