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## **EU Customs Union**


Single common customs territory with no border controls on the goods moved between the EU's Member States.




Largest trading block in the world, accounting for over 15% of the world's trade in goods.

Uniform measures for handling the import, export and transit of goods governed by a common set of rules called the Union Customs Code (UCC).






Regulation (EU) 2022/2399 on EU SWE-C entered into force on 12 December 2022.



## Benefits of interfacing EU certification systems with the EU SWE-C

Streamlined trade processes	Improved compliance with EU regulations	Enhanced transparency and traceability	Efficient quantity management	Data harmonisation and standardisation	Risk management and safety
Helps reduce paperwork and administrative burdens through automated checks, making it easier for third- countries to export to the EU.	Helps third countries comply with EU sanitary, photosanitary and forestry regulations, essential for accessing the EU market.	Increases transparency in the supply chain, ensuring the safety and traceability of goods entering the EU.	Facilitates accurate tracking and management of imported quantities, ensuring compliance with specified limits and optimising trade efficiency.	Streamlines data harmonisation across different standards, ensuring uniformity and accuracy in the data exchanged between 3 <sup>rd</sup> countries and the EU.	By facilitating better data exchange, the interface indirectly aids in risk management, enhancing the safety of food and forestry products.
