


KEY CONCEPTS

Tenure Security: The protection of the right to ownership and other rights *in rem* over the Land


Geospatial Information: Data that is referenced to a location or place, such as geographic coordinates, or an address. It describes 'where' all things are, and provides the digital connection between a place, its people, and their activities.

Land Administration: the process of determining, recording, disseminating, and updating information about the relationship between people and land.




SCENARIO STUDY FOR LAND ADMINISTRATION
