# Development of the ITC Strategy on Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Inland Transport

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## **Mandate**



**Decisions of ITC at its 85<sup>th</sup> annual session** (Geneva, 21-24 February 2023, see report ECE/TRANS/328, para. 60):

On the basis of ECE/TRANS/2023/21, the Committee

- requested the secretariat, in close cooperation with the Committee's Bureau and relevant subsidiary bodies, to develop an ambitious strategy document for reducing Green House Gas (GHG) emissions in inland transport based on international United Nations legal instruments under the Committee's purview with priority actions for the Inland Transport Committee (ITC) and all its relevant subsidiary bodies, supported by a strong action plan with milestones, for consideration and possible adoption by the Committee at its 86th plenary session (2024)
- requested the secretariat to report biennially through in-depth reports to the
   Committee on climate change and inland transport, starting at the Committee's 86<sup>th</sup> session in 2024.

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## **Mandate**



(Continued) Decisions of ITC at its 85th annual session (see report ECE/TRANS/328, para. 60):

On the basis of ECE/TRANS/2023/21, the Committee also

- requested the relevant subsidiary bodies and treaty bodies to accord priority to timely amendments to the
   UN inland transport legal instruments under the Committee's purview to support safe and efficient
   achievement of the targets, commitments and solutions on climate change;
- requested its relevant subsidiary bodies to continue efforts towards harmonization of performance requirements and intelligent transport systems related legal instruments directly contributing to reduction of GHG emissions through improvement of fuel/energy use efficiency; efficient use of transport networks; shift from private cars to public transport when available; flexible load and storage resources for the power grid (electric cars) and automation;
- Requested its subsidiary bodies and treaty bodies to intensify efforts towards digitalization of main United
   Nations inland transport conventions
- Invited its relevant subsidiary bodies to reflect on environmental and energy efficiency considerations.

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# **Draft Strategy Content**



#### Vision

Taking action towards the aspirational goal of net zero GHG emissions from inland transport by 2050

#### Mission

- Contribution through enhanced regulatory support, intergovernmental policy dialogue and increased coordination and partnership
- Application of a broad decarbonization framework, drawing on avoid-shift-improve measures

#### Initial ITC Climate Action Plan with milestones

- Contains initial action items for ITC and its subsidiary bodies to drive the change towards achieving the vision, mission and strategic objectives for curbing GHG emissions from inland transport
- Joint and coordinated action among subsidiary bodies
- Indicative target years for implementation of each action
- Living document: Biennial reviews to allow for adjustments and additional actions proposed by subsidiary bodies and for removal of completed actions

# Development of the draft Strategy: Consultation process



#### Zero Draft

- Prepared by the Secretariat in close cooperation with the ITC Bureau and with input from ITC's subsidiary bodies, following ITC's request at its 85<sup>th</sup> annual session
- Circulated to ECE member States, Contracting Parties and Chairs and Vice-Chairs of ITC's subsidiary bodies on 29 November 2023
- Deadline for comments: 22 December 2023

#### Draft 1

- Incorporation of comments received
- Circulated for feedback on 10 January 2024
- Deadline for feedback on the comments: 26 January 2024

#### Draft 2

- Secretariat is currently consolidating comments and working towards consensus
- To be circulated before the ITC session
- Possible adoption during the restricted session on 21 February 2024

#### High-level Statement of Support to the adoption of the Strategy

To be endorsed by Ministers and Heads of delegations at the end of the High-level segment of the 86th ITC session on 20 February 2024
