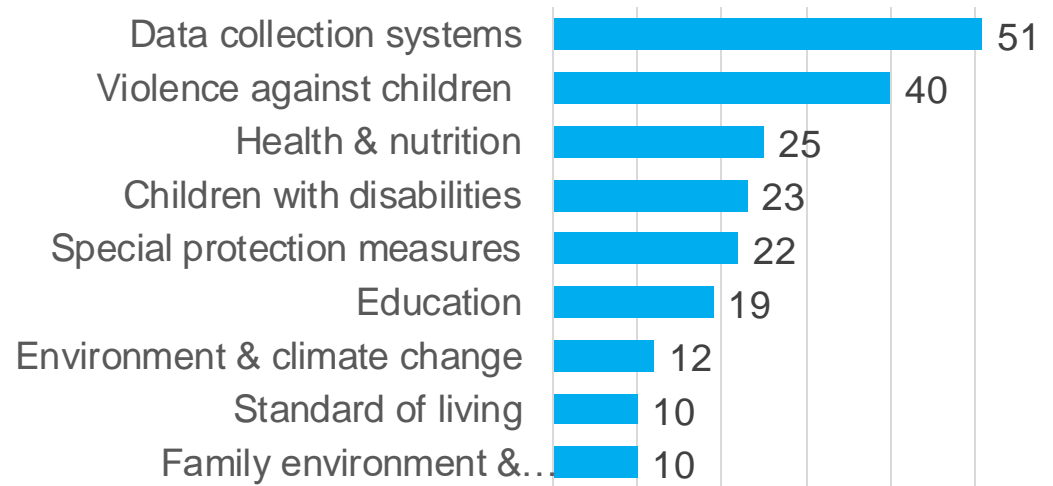


Europe and Central Asia Child Rights Monitoring Framework

Update and Next Steps

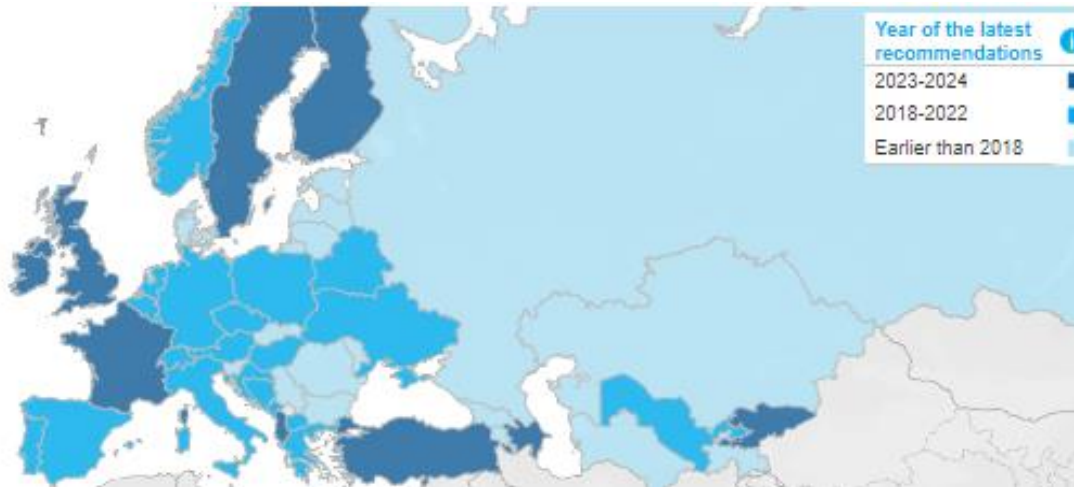


Effective coordination, harmonisation and sharing of data with line ministries.

Disseminating data on children in accessible formats / data analysis and use in policymaking.

Data disaggregation and collection with a focus on the most vulnerable children.

Centralised, integrated, comprehensive data collection system and database covering all child rights.

ECA Child Rights Monitoring Framework

VISION

Gradually move towards a **regional list of core indicators** on children and child rights.

Regional roadmap for statistical and methodological work for child rights with limited or no comparable measures.

Progress in 2023

The **descriptions** of domains, sub-domains, and **linkages** refined and finalised.

The **first version of the indicator mapping** completed and will be shared soon.

Available data for the indicators identified and brought into the TransMonEE database.

The global list of child-related SDG indicators adapted to constitute a **regional dashboard on SDG data availability**.

Next steps



Consultations with NSOs and other stakeholders (*proposed action*)

Revisions to the indicator framework and update of data availability for the region.

Discussions about the common work to improve the availability of comparable statistics in sub-domains with weak or no indicators

Support to country-level & cross-country learning and exchanges.

When reviewing

Relevance and completeness

Are these the most relevant comparable indicators to measure the realisation of child rights and policies in this particular sub-domain?

Feasibility

Is the indicator relatively easy to monitor?

Frequency

With what frequency the indicator can and should be monitored?

Representation and disaggregation

Are we leaving out certain groups of children?

Quality

Does the methodology and data source allow for ensuring quality?

What are we missing?
