

Example of media impact of the Water Convention on World Water Day 2024 ("Water & Peace")

- **High visibility: 357 articles** including reprints in 8 languages reaching a potential audience of over **511 million people.**
- Impactful interviews: Interview of Sonja Koeppel with news agency dpa featured in almost all major German speaking written media; some top-tier outlets such as Al Jazeera also reflected Sonja Koeppel's interview with news agency AFP.

• UN message: Secretary General's message, urging Water Convention accession, was also an important

Focal points to the Water Convention: key communication channel

- → Main **channel of communication** between the secretariat, the country concerned and other countries on Convention-related matters.
- → Key role in **promoting and (for Parties) implementing** the Convention, as outlined in the strategy for the implementation of the Convention at the global level.

Main responsibilities:

- → Receive notifications of meetings, activities and other information related to the Convention and disseminate such information to other relevant national authorities, organizations and the general public, as appropriate;
- → Facilitate regular and active involvement of the country in the activities under the Convention;
- → Ensure and facilitate, through the appropriate consultative process, the preparation and submission of national reports under the Convention, SDG global indicator 6.5.2 on transboundary water cooperation;
- → **Follow up on secretariat requests** (information and inputs based on decisions by the Meeting of the Parties or other subsidiary bodies);
- → Disseminate information on the implementation of the Convention and other relevant national developments in the framework of the Convention's meetings and those of other relevant national and international forums;
- → Facilitate possible voluntary contributions to the Convention's trust fund;

Water Convention's Focal points current status:

Countries Parties to the Water Convention (52 in total)	Countries non Parties to the Water Convention (111 in total)
Number of Parties with a focal point: 50	Number of Non-Parties with a focal point: 61
Number of Parties without a focal point: 2	Number of Non-Parties without a focal point: 50

Key messages on the focal points

- -All countries Parties to the Convention which have not yet done so, are requested to officially designate a focal point before MoP 10 (October 2024)
- -Countries non-Parties to the Convention which have not yet done so, are encouraged to officially designate a focal point by the MoP 10
- -Being a focal point does not have any financial implications—it is rather an in kind-role (opportunity to share your country experiences in the Convention's platform)
- -Nominating a focal point does not imply any commitment to ratify the Water Convention

Key messages on the focal points

- Possibility to nominate more than one focal point; focal points can come from different Ministries (eg. Water, Foreign Affairs) and from different levels
- -If a **change occurs**, please **communicate it to the secretariat** with new focal point contacts
- -Focal points should mobilize **appropriate expertise** within their country (tailored to the topics discussed in meetings/conferences)
- -Focal points should report back to their Ministry when taking part in the Water Convention related activities (two way channel)
